The Blues Scale 5 shapes Ok, To the left are the 5 shapes of **Minor Blues** the blues scale. The blues scale is basically or shape 1 a Pentatonic scale with an added note (a b5). The added note transforms the sound of a Pentatonic to a more bluesy sounds but DON'T hang about on the blues note as it will sound awful, if used as a passing note the blues note (b5) will ad that special blues sound giving new life to 5 what can sometime become a boring Pentatonic sound. Don't be fooled by the name of the scale (blues) as you can use this scale over pretty much any genre of **Major blues** music and it will sounds absolutetly brilliant if learnt or shape 2 and used correctly. Please note if playing major blues the root note will be For ideas on how to use this scale check out my The root will also youtube channel "crashmonk1" shift accordingly for the other shapes 8 Shape 3 10 Shape 4 12 One of the most Effective ways to learn these shapes is to start by looking at each shape individually for approx 90 seconds without actually playing the guitar, then imagine playing the scale as you read through it, thinking about the fret spaces (intervals) between each note and trying to remember the patterns on each string. Eventually building the image of the whole shape in your Shape 5 mind without needing the guitar in hand. Then try to play the shape on the guitar. Repeat this process until all shapes have been memorized!! This is one way of ensuring the image stays in the mind. 15
